1986—Liability Shield

Vaccine makers were granted 100% immunity from liability under the 1986 National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act. Parents/consumers cannot sue vaccine companies when their products injure. Since then, the childhood vaccine schedule has significantly increased. There are now hundreds of new vaccines in development.

<p>Full Vaccination</p> <p>While many parents/consumers follow the schedule of vaccines currently recommended by the CDC, they realize the importance of consumer choice.</p>	<p>Delayed Vaccination*</p> <p>Infants and children can receive up to 8 shots in a single office visit. Many parents choose to separate or delay those shots.</p>	<p>Selective Vaccination*</p> <p>Ever skip the flu shot? That's vaccine choice. Consumers like choosing which vaccine products to take or decline.</p>	<p>Opting Out of Vaccination*</p> <p>Some make conscientious choices about health including non-pharmaceutical options. Also, some who witness vaccine injury opt out of future doses—even though they were fully vaccinating at one time.</p>
